


## Goals of the Master Parks and Trails Plan

**Create** a community-based plan to steer the future of Perry's parks and trails in a cohesive direction

**Provide** a wide-array of activities that meets the needs of Perry's citizens

**Promote** strategic investment in capital improvements, operations and maintenance within Perry's Parks and Trails system

**Connect** commercial, recreational and employment hubs, to increase accessibility for diverse modes of transportation



## Public Input Process

  - Local media (Perry News, Perry Chief, and Racoon River Valley Radio)
- Steering Committees
  - Gives residents the chance to guide the direction of our research
- Perry Community School District
  - o Gives us viable input from park-users
- Focus groups
  - Allows citizen groups of similar interest provide insight via open conversation

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

## Key Survey Results

- 5.2% of survey respondents use the Park system within perry on a daily basis and 31.2% on a weekly basis
- Personal Automobile identified as most popular mode of travel to Parks in Perry (63%)





Word cloud answer for Q4.7 "What would encourage you to use the parks more?

- 66.7% indicated travel time to nearest park is 0-5 minutes
- 78.9% of survey respondents said they feel safe in Perry's parks.
  - More Lighting
  - Adapting police presence
- 46.9% stated that they were satisfied with the park system in Perry
- 92% of survey respondents were in favor for an outdoor aquatics center in Perry.

# Needs Assessment & Recommendations

Parks

#### Recommendations - Pattee Park

- Lighting added to baseball fields and soccer complex
- Construct new bathroom facilities
- Construct enclosed shelter house
- Updated trail and road surfacing within park
- Renovated RV Parking area
  - If camping stays at this location, clear designated spots for camping, electrical hookups for RV's
- Signage indicating location of fields and facilities
  - Signage in and out of park, directional markings of field locations, restrooms, shelter, etc.







#### Needs Assessment - Pattee Park

- Playgrounds need significant investment & replacement
- There is a need for additional playground equipment
  - Variety of climbing playscapes
- Horseshoes critically underused
- Skatepark showing age, underutilized
- Camping area unmarked, without hookups
- Separation needed at the northwest residential-park boundary
- Shelters; restroom facilities need replacement, renovation
- Sports complex: Lighting needs replacement



#### Needs Assessment - Perkins Park

- Entrances are uninviting, fails to show brush clearing that's been completed
- Parking is low quality and far away
  - No handicapped spaces
- Lighting is limited
- Nature area is unappreciated & perceived as unsafe
- No supporting infrastructure for soccer
- Need to combat negative perceptions



#### Recommendations - Perkins Park

- Increase safety by increasing lighting and visibility throughout park
- Updated trails and parking lots
- Establish a nature walk
- Plant native species and design for ecological conservation
- Build bathroom and shelter facilities
- Increase educational opportunities
- Create vegetation buffer to prevent Frog Creek erosion
- Potential for primitive bike camping facilities







#### Needs Assessment - Wiese Park

- Clear signage needed, indicating entrance, exits, points of interest.
- Shelters, increase upkeep budget
- Recreation, included public activities
- Need to develop park character
- Disc Golf needs redesign



#### Recommendations - Wiese Park

- Public art projects
- Programming and partnering with schools
- Added signage for bike trails and loops within park
- Redesign of disc golf
- Maintain trail loops within park
- Replace and build new shelters
- Evaluation of park amenities
- Addition of outdoor aquatic center connected to McCreary Center.









### Recommendations - Wiese Park Aquatic Center

- Design of outdoor pool & programming
- Evaluation of park amenities
- Construction of outdoor pool
- Sharing of staff and resources with current
  McCreary Center indoor pool
- Target window: within 5 years







#### Needs Assessment - Caboose Park

- Develop Caboose Park into both a trailhead and rest area for the regional trails, as well as a community park space
  - Install amenities for cyclists, including benches, water refill stations, showers, and shaded seating
- Additional amenities such as green spaces, playgrounds, and restrooms

#### Recommendations - Caboose Park

- Add signage for the regional trails as well as Caboose
  Park
- Redesign the open spaces and existing green spaces as well as underutilized space in the parking lot
- Increase the amount of seating and resting space
- Find more temporary or a permanent use for the existing shed (former farmers market)
- Add amenities for out-of town cyclists such as water refill stations, showers, bike repair, and camping areas










#### Needs Assessment - New Parks

- Northgate Estates north on 1st Avenue has no sidewalk access and is far away from all Perry parks
- Southern Perry, particularly south of Highway 141, lies outside the service area for community parks and is proximate to dangerous, high speed traffic
- The area around Quail Run Apartments in east Perry has extremely limited sidewalk access, high traffic on Willis, and lies outside the parks service area





## Recommendation - Neighborhood Parks

- Identify and begin to acquire land near the Northgate Estates, south of 141, and in the low income neighborhood near the middle and high school.
- Acquire land in the medium term of 6-15 years.
- Develop neighborhood parks and investigate need for pocket parks in the long term of 16-30 years.








# Needs Assessment & Recommendations

Trails

#### Needs Assessment - Local Trails

- Maintenance, seasonal upkeep
- Character, resident inputs to add uniquely Perry flair
- Amenities, additional lighting, signage and wayfinding, water filling stations, benches
- Expansion, clearly marked route connecting
  High Trestle Regional Trail with Raccoon River
  Regional trail
  - Expanded route designation to areas of interest in Perry, i.e., parks, downtown, Hotel Pattee, La Poste, etc.



#### Recommendations - Local Trails

- Loop trail connecting city parks
- Establish urban trails
- Wayfinding and signage
- Bench seating at parks along local trail
- Sidewalks along high traffic roadways
- Public art along trails
- Complete local network signage
- StoryWalk
- Bike lanes throughout the city
- Improved and new lighting along trails











## Needs Assessment - Regional Trails

- Signage indications to areas of interest within Perry
  - o Connection points between Raccoon River Trail and High Trestle Trail
- Connectivity of city streets and sidewalks between regional trail



## Recommendations - Regional Trails

\*Dependant on Dallas County Approval

- Wayfinding and signage
- Bench seating
- Art as wayfinding
- Repaving any trails, updated connections
- Additional lighting in poorly lit areas of connecting trails
- Bike camping designations within city parks and along
  - intercity and regional trails
